


On June 6th, St. Mary's Choir was invited by Gert Kayser, formally of Salem, to come and sing for them at her home in Madison, at Bethel Nursing home. Gert is only 100 years young and still going strong.

This was just what we needed a road trip – the choir formed its union and sang for the first time Christmas of 1976 with 6 members and as of today we have 4 of the original members still with us. We sing with passion and the love of our faith. No one has a formal degree in music, unless you would call Sr. Amica, a 4ft 8in whirlwind of music, that taught the original six who attended St. Mary's grade and high school, formal training.

Through the years many have come and gone from the group at present we are 20 members strong. We sing music from unison to 4 part harmony, A Capella, with guitars, piano, or organ. We have traveled 5 states to sing, we have sung at Blue Cloud Abbey, St. Joseph's Cathedral, State Fair, TV mass, Mass in the Parks, the State Penitentiary, Nursing Homes; sung for St. Mary's Centennial Mass, Ordinations, Weddings, Funerals, Anniversaries, First Communion, Confirmations, Graduations and weekend masses too numerous to count. We have sang with 7 pastors and 2 retired residential priests along with many visiting priests.

We have never taken a dime from our Parish – if we needed funds for music or an instrument, such as the baby grand piano, we did fundraisers in the form of concerts and free will donations, we even have made a CD of our music at one of our concerts and sold those. Practice for many many years was every Wednesday night; we work hard at getting it right, but we are our own worst critics "Where there is a Will there is a Way." We have been known to sing for food and always try and gather together once or twice a year for a potluck and stories again too numerous to mention but through all of this the good times and the bad we have formed a bond that is unbreakable and maybe that is why sometimes we sound like one voice. There are 19 steps to the choir loft and an Old Saying that when you Sing you Pray Twice, well one of those prayers is that we can still get up to the choir loft to continue our music ministry as we hope we will be able to continue for many more years. *Thanks for listening to us all these years*.
