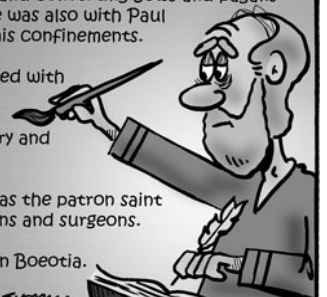
SAINTS FUN FACTS

St. Luke was born in Syria and trained as a physician.
 He was also one of the most extensive writers of the
 New Testament. In addition to his gospels, he also
 wrote the 'Acts of the Apostles.'

He was one of 'the seventy' and worked with St. Paul,
 traveling to Rome and converting Jews and pagans
 to Christianity. He was also with Paul
 during several of his confinements.

Luke is also credited with
 being a prolific
 painter, creating
 many works of Mary and
 Jesus.



St. Luke is known as the patron saint
 of artists, physicians and surgeons.

He died at age 84 in Boeotia.

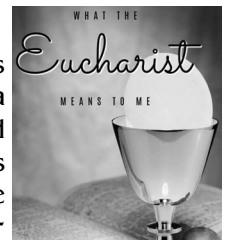

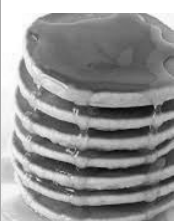
DO YOU HAVE QUESTIONS ABOUT THE EUCHARIST?

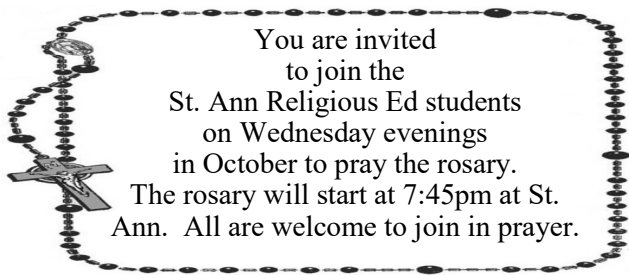
