



The Catholic Church celebrates All Saints' Day on November 1st each year. All Saints' Day was established by Pope Boniface IV, but it was Pope Gregory III who set the date to November 1 back in the mid 700s. This special day is dedicated to all the saints of the church. The church defines a saint as anyone who has entered heaven, not just those who have been canonized. It is believed that there are millions, perhaps even billions of saints whom we celebrate each year. All Saints' Day, is a holy day of obligation,

meaning it is required that you attend mass.

Different countries have their own ways of celebrating. In Austria and France many people take flowers to the graves of their deceased loved ones. The beatitudes can be understood as an outline of how to live a good, Christian life. The saints are people who lived according to the beatitudes and we are called to follow in their footsteps.
