PASTORATE NAME BEING SUBMITTED FOR THE BISHOP'S APPROVAL: I want to



thank everyone who participated in the survey on selecting a sacred name for the pastorate. There were a number of excellent suggestions made, beyond those proposed. About 4 or 5 people suggested St. Mother of Teresa of Calcutta – a saint of our times. A couple of people suggested either St. Joseph or: Jesus, Mary, & Joseph: the Holy Family, as models

and protectors of family life, which is very fitting for our times. There were also suggestions for patrons of agriculture, which, of course, would also fit this pastorate quite well. Divine Mercy, The 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit, St. Anthony of Padua, Immaculate Heart, Sacred Heart, St. Michael the Archangel, and St. Mary of Mercy were among the other excellent suggestions. All of these fine, well thought out, and judicious suggestions actually made selecting just one even more difficult! In the end, however, St. Mary Magdalene took a clear and decisive lead, accumulating 42% of all votes, with St. Peter the Apostle and St. Francis of Assisi equally split with 29% each. I'm hoping this reflects the will of our Lord. St. Mary Magdalene, then, will be the sacred name submitted to the bishop for this pastorate. Many people didn't get their first choice, all of which were excellent choices. Remember, though, that we can't go wrong with a sacred name. The saints, the mysteries of the faith, and our Lord (while distinct) form a single body, a single whole, there is no opposition amongst them. Our Holy Mother, the Apostles, the angels, and all the saints sit at table now (so to speak) with our Lord. In a certain sense, you can't pick one without picking them all. Thank you again and God Bless You, Fr. Kuhn.

Bishop DeGrood has chosen to name me as a Senior Priest which will become effective July 2, 2024. Senior Priests no longer have direct involvement in "Parish" ministry with given parish communities. If a parish needs you to "fill in" for them, then you are welcome to do that.

If you know me, that wasn't my hope or desire to transition to Senior Priest. Yes, I am 81. When I moved 3 years ago, I was grateful I would still have the opportunity for celebrating daily Mass where the community could participate. I will not have that privilege now. Any time now for celebration of Mass in public, permission for use of the space in a church will be a reality. The only place where to feel "at home" will be a room in my living quarters for Mass.

Daily Mass has always been a big part of my life even as a lay person, my first 30 years including walking down for Mass while in college.

I have always appreciated celebrating Mass where the laity may be fed. Jesus wasn't alone at the Last Supper! There were times when no one showed up but still the invitation was there but I offered.

Thank you for the privileges these past years. You will be in my prayers wherever this reality leads me. I ask for yours.
