

CFSA Update and Explanation



I would like to thank everyone who has donated to CFSA. Here is an update for each parish on how much more is needed to reach the parish's assessment: St. Stephen, \$29; St. Mary's (Salem), \$2,595; St. Ann, \$1,747; St. Mary (Alexandria), \$605; St. Patrick, \$910; Epiphany, \$2,475.

It is better for the parish to reach the goal or even go over. First of all, each parish has to pay off their assessment, whether the goal is reached with CFSA donations or not. If a parish's assess-

ment is (say) \$10,000 and only \$9,000 is collected for CFSA, then the parish has to pay \$1,000 out of their regular income/savings. So it's going to get paid, whether it comes out of donations made directly to CFSA or par-

Furthermore, a parish's CFSA is completely determined by their number of registered households and income. If a parish goes over their assessment, the amount over stays at the parish and does not count as income the following year. So it's like untaxed income. If the parish CFSA assessment is \$10,000 and they collect \$11,000 in CFSA donations, then \$1,000 stays at the parish and does not count as income in the following year's assessment. On the other hand, if the parish does not meet its assessment, it's a double loss because then CFSA has to be paid using parish income that does count as income in the following year's assessment. So even if you have contributed to CFSA, you might consider contributing your next parish donation to CFSA instead so as to meet (and possibly even exceed) the assessment. Fr. Kuhn.
