


LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Examples would be social events like breakfasts, dinners, etc., but also various liturgical and devotional events as well. Hopefully having one bulletin will help facilitate this. Seven parishes and one bulletin means less room in the bulletin. This will apply especially to pictures, which will be used at most occasionally, if it all. The collection report will also be limited to the total collection - loose and envelopes -- for the weekend. Thank you and God bless you, Fr. Kuhn.

As the McCook County Food Pantry works to meet the food needs in our community, it has taken on responsibility for the Backpack program for McCook Central School along with the regular pantry service. With this increased cost, we would like to ask community members for assistance. This supplemental food is sent home with students each week as needed. Each bag contains the following items: (1- 15 oz. Peanut butter, 1- can chicken noodle soup, 2- packages ramen noodles, 1- tuna meal pack, 2 - cans tuna, 1- can SpaghettiOs, 1- 4 pack individual applesauce or pudding cups). These are items young people can prepare for themselves. If you would like to assist in this important project, please double bag these items in grocery bags and place them in the church vestibule. The Church has entered into the longest part of the liturgical year, a season known as Ordinary Time. It is ironic that the term "ordinary" would be applied to any aspect of the life of the most amazing person who ever walked the earth. Absolutely nothing about Our Lord's life was ordinary. Yet this is what we call the weeks in the Church calendar that fall outside of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter.

We might think of it as a time to get back to our ordinary life and put faith on a back burner. We are free of the sacrifices, penance and preparation of Advent and Lent. We do not have the feasting and celebration of Christmas and Easter. It seems like an easy time of the year. Nothing could be further from the truth.

Ordinary Time presents us with the extraordinary opportunity to meet Jesus as the first apostles and disciples met him. We hear Our Lord's teachings and parables. We see his many miracles. And through it all, we, too, must decide whether we are true followers of this extraordinary man or just curious bystanders. We do not have to do this alone. We are aided in this silent and gradual spiritual growth by the Holy Spirit, who helps us live each day to the fullest and who inspires our prayers and makes our seemingly ordinary lives into an eternal offering to the glory of God.

Ordinary Time is not very ordinary at all. Ordinary Time occurs during the calendar seasons of summer growth and fall harvest. These natural seasons, along with the green vestments worn during Ordinary Time, remind us this is a time to grow in our faith by adopting simple and sustainable practices that can help us be better followers of Jesus. Quite simply, we are asked to decide how fully we want to follow this extraordinary man named Jesus.
