


WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A CATHEDRAL AND A BASILICA? A **cathedral** is the home church for the bishop or archbishop of a Catholic diocese. It takes its name from the bishop's chair, called a *cathedra* in Latin, which traditionally represents the seat of power and authority of the leader of the diocese. A **basilica** is an important church building designated by the pope because it carries special spiritual, historical, and/or architectural significance. Basilica is the highest permanent designation for a church building, and once a church is named a basilica, it cannot lose its basilica status.

**EXTRA CONFESSION TIMES FOR LENT**: Confession is not a once a year or twice a year sacrament. It is for the whole year long. A good traditional practice in the Church is once a month. Nonetheless, Advent and Lent are special seasons of repentance and so extra Confession times will be offered, in addition to the regularly scheduled times. PLEASE NOTE that you most certainly can and are most welcome, to go to Confession at any parish for any of the times listed; you're not limited to your own parish. In fact, the scheduled times are counting on people doing that to some degree. One other note is that there is a Confirmation Mass on April 6th (scheduled by the chancery) which pretty much eliminates that Sunday for extra Confession time. For the afternoon times, the priest will be in the confessional for a minimum 30 minutes (whether anyone is coming or not), but will also remain until all Confessions are heard.

# WEEKLY SCHEDULE FOR STATIONS OF THE CROSS DURING LENT



Stations of the Cross are one of the most ancient devotions in the Church. It is believed that Mary herself walked the path our Lord took to His crucifixion every day

after His death, meditating on His Passion. There is no better way to be struck by the love of God than meditation on our Lord's Passion. It is refreshing, uplifting, and enlivening. Friday Stations during Lent are a devotion that have fallen by the wayside way too much. What a shame. Imagine if it was your earthly father who made such a sacrifice for you. Would you just forget about it? Would you not want to recall it and honor it? As good as our earthly fathers most often are, our Lord is an even greater Father, and yet so often even Mass-attending Catholics just let His sacrifice pass by, even during a special season set aside for the purpose of recalling, in a special way, that sacrifice. Parents, be parents. Bring your family. If kids do not learn to do extra things for the faith, for our Lord, their chances of staying in the faith are slim. Make a commitment to get to Stations at least twice this Lent, if not every week.

# LENTEN DAYS OF FASTING AND ABSTINENCE


Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting *and* abstinence. Every Friday during Lent is a day of abstinence. To willingly not fast or abstain on prescribed days, without serious (e.g., medical) reason, is sinful.

**Fasting:** - Eating at most: • One regular size main meal; • 2 other smaller meals which, if combined, would not be larger than the main meal

- No eating between meals: - Applies to everyone between the ages of 18 and 59: - Required on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

**Abstinence:** - No eating meat: - Applies to everyone 14 years and older (no upper age limit): - Required on: Ash Wednesday, every Friday during Lent, and Good Friday.
