

DIVINE MERCY CELEBRATIONS: SUNDAY, APRIL 27

In the 1930's, our Lord appeared to a simple, humble Polish nun, who is now known as St. Faustina. He appeared to her many times with a variety of messages but His main and continuous emphasis was on practicing devotion to Divine Mercy; devotions are prayerful practices outside of Mass (or in addition to Mass). In response to our Lord's messages and requests issued through St. Faustina, Pope St. John Paul II established an Indulgence for Divine Mercy Sunday, which states (in part):

"And so the Supreme Pontiff, motivated by an ardent desire to foster in Christians this devotion to Divine Mercy as much as possible...granted the following Indulgences: a plenary indulgence, granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer for the intentions of Supreme Pontiff) to the faithful who, on the Second Sunday of Easter or Divine Mercy Sunday, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy..." (A partial Indulgence can also be obtained through the same means.)

Here is a very small sample of our Lord's words to St. Faustina:

"On that day [Divine Mercy Sunday] all the Divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity." [699 of Diary]

"...whoever approaches the Fount of Life [The Sacrament of Confession] on this day [Feast of Divine Mercy] will be granted complete remission of sins and punishment." [300 of Diary] "On that day, priests are to tell everyone about my great and unfathomable mercy." [570]

Thus, in fidelity to our Lord's request and to the guidance of His Church, there will be two Divine Mercy celebrations on Divine Mercy Sunday — Sunday, April 27, starting at 1:30 pm:

- St. Ann's, Humboldt
- St. Mary of Mercy, Alexandria.

There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and silent Adoration, Confession, display of the Divine Mercy Image, and recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3 pm; the priest might say a few words about St. Faustina and Divine Mercy. Prayers will conclude at approximately 4:00 pm with Benediction. Confessions will continue as long as people are coming.

Needless to say, both/either of these are for all of the parishes, and, indeed anyone who would like to come. At this point, I plan to rotate it across parishes from year to year. Don't let it pass you by, don't say: it's not at my parish. What difference does it make what parish it's at — come for this special encounter with the Lord and His Mercy as He Himself promised. Fr. Kuhn.
