



CFSA UPDATE

The amounts donated towards CFSA so far this year for each parish, along with each parish's assessment (amount owed) are below.

It is beneficial to the parish to pay off CFSA directly, and even to go over the assessed amount (or "goal"). Here's a little information on how it works to help see why:

The parish will have to pay off the total amount owed regardless of how much is donated directly to CFSA.

If the CFSA donations are less than the amount owed (the goal), then the rest comes out of the parish's income.

The CFSA assessment (how much is owed) is based entirely on: number of registered households and the parish's income.

If the amount donated to CFSA is over the goal, the remainder stays at the parish and does NOT count as income in the following year's assessment. So "overage" is like untaxed income.

If a parish doesn't meet the goal, then they are paying off CFSA using income that is counted towards next year's assessment. If more than the assessed amount is paid to CFSA, then the parish is getting income that will not be counted as part of the following year's assessment. So it is far better to go over the goal than to go under.

Example:

Goal / Amount Assessed = \$10,000

Scenario 1: parish collects less than the goal (less than \$10,000)

Parish has income of \$100,000 (not counting CFSA donations)

Parish collects \$8,000 in CFSA donations (\$2,000 short)

Parish pays \$2,000 out of income

Total income is \$100,000 and \$2,000 is used for CFSA

Amount of income used for assessment next year: \$100,000

Scenario 2: parish goes over the goal in CFSA collections

Parish has income of \$98,000 (not counting CFSA donations)

Parish collects \$12,000 in CFSA donations (\$2,000 over)

No income is used to pay CFSA

Total income is \$100,000 = \$98,000 + \$2,000 (the amount collected over the goal)

Amount of income used for parish's assessment next year is \$98,000, NOT 100,000.

It is to the parish's benefit, then, to donate to CFSA -- even instead of parish donations -- at least until the goal is met.



- **St. Martin:** Goal: \$18,000.00, Amount Received: \$18,865.00, Amount Over Goal: \$865.00
- **St. Ann:** Goal: \$25,500.00, Amount Received: \$28,027.26, Amount Over Goal: \$2,527.26
- **St. Stephen:** Goal: \$8,500.00, Amount Received: \$7,100.00, Remaining Amount: \$1,400.00
- **Epiphany:** Goal: \$11,000.00, Amount Received: \$7,605.00, Remaining Amount: \$3,395.00
- **St. Patrick:** Goal: 32,000.00, Amount Received: \$19,653.25, Remaining Amount: \$12,346.75

The Church has entered into the longest part of the liturgical year, a season known as Ordinary Time. It is ironic that the term “ordinary” would be applied to any aspect of the life of the most amazing person who ever walked the earth. Absolutely nothing about Our Lord’s life was ordinary. Yet this is what we call the weeks in the Church calendar that fall outside of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter.

We might think of it as a time to get back to our ordinary life and put faith on a back burner. We are free of the sacrifices, penance and preparation of Advent and Lent. We do not have the feasting and celebration of Christmas and Easter. It seems like an easy time of the year. Nothing could be further from the truth.

Ordinary Time presents us with the extraordinary opportunity to meet Jesus as the first apostles and disciples met him. We hear Our Lord’s teachings and parables. We see his many miracles. And through it all, we, too, must decide whether we are true followers of this extraordinary man or just curious bystanders. We do not have to do this alone. We are aided in this silent and gradual spiritual growth by the Holy Spirit, who helps us live each day to the fullest and who inspires our prayers and makes our seemingly ordinary lives into an eternal offering to the glory of God.

Ordinary Time is not very ordinary at all. Ordinary Time occurs during the calendar seasons of summer growth and fall harvest. These natural seasons, along with the green vestments worn during Ordinary Time, remind us this is a time to grow in our faith by adopting simple and sustainable practices that can help us be better followers of Jesus. Quite simply, we are asked to decide how fully we want to follow this extraordinary man named Jesus.
